A NOTE ON TONIGHT'S SERVICE


Maundy Thursday's name is derived from the Latin "mandatum," which is translated, "mandate," or "commandment." The service commemorates the Thursday afternoon in which Jesus was betrayed. His time in the upper room with His disciples is described in each of the Gospels, though most thoroughly in John 13-17. John 13:34, in which Jesus said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another," is the reference of the word "mandatum."

The service begins with the service of Corporate Confession and Absolution. This short service is reminiscent of the Absolution received individually on Ash Wednesday. After the Words of Forgiveness, worshipers are invited to greet each other, using the words "Peace be with you." This is a sign that even as we have received forgiveness from our many sins, we are willing to grant that forgiveness and speak peace to our neighbors as well. In tonight's service, we celebrate the Lord's Supper, as it was first instituted by our Lord on Maundy Thursday.

This year, our Lenten journey has introduced the idea of "keeping vigil." For six weeks, we have heard about waiting patiently for the Lord's deliverance. Tonight, we enter the Holy "Triduum," the Holy Three Days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. These services were originally viewed as one long service, stretched over these three days. For that reason, services tonight and tomorrow will not end with a Benediction—tonight, the altar will be stripped, symbolizing the preparation for Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Join us tomorrow at 7:00pm as the service continues. Tonight's offerings have been designated for Missions.

CONFESSIONAL ADDRESS

During this Lenten season we have heard our Lord's call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that prevents us from trusting in God and loving each other. Since it is our intention to receive the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ on this night when He instituted this blessed meal for our salvation, it is proper that we complete our Lenten discipline by diligently examining ourselves, as St. Paul urges us to do. This holy Sacrament has been instituted for the special comfort of those who are troubled because of their sin and who humbly confess their sins, fear God's wrath, and hunger and thirst for righteousness.

But when we examine our hearts and consciences, we find nothing in us but sin and death, from which we are incapable of delivering ourselves. Therefore, our Lord Jesus Christ has had mercy on us. For our benefit He became man so that He might fulfill for us the whole will and law of God and, to deliver us, took upon Himself our sin and the punishment we deserve.

So that we may more confidently believe this and be strengthened in the faith and in holy living, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, broke it, and gave it to His disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you." It is as if He said, "I became man, and all that I do and suffer is for your good. As a pledge of this, I give you My body to eat."

In the same way also He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." Again, it is as if He said, "I have had mercy on you by taking into Myself all your iniquities. I give Myself into death, shedding My blood to obtain grace and forgiveness of sins, and to comfort and establish the new testament, which gives forgiveness and everlasting salvation. As a pledge of this, I give you My blood to drink."

Therefore, whoever eats this bread and drinks this cup, confidently believing this Word and promise of Christ, dwells in Christ and Christ in him and has eternal life.

We should also do this in remembrance of Him, showing His death—that He was delivered for our offenses and raised for our justification. Giving Him our most heartfelt thanks, we take up our cross and follow Him and, according to His commandment, love one another as He has loved us. As our Lord on this night exemplified this love by washing His disciples' feet, so we by our words and actions serve one another in love. For we are all one bread and one body, even as we are all partakers of this one bread and drink from the one cup. For just as the one cup is filled with the wine of many grapes and one bread made from countless grains, so also we, being many, are one body in Christ. Because of Him, we love one another, not only in word, but in deed and in truth. May the almighty and merciful God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by His Holy Spirit, accomplish this in us.

Please stand. Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.

- P O almighty God, merciful Father,
- I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess unto Thee all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended Thee and justly deserved Thy temporal and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray Thee of Thy boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Thy beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being.
- P Almighty God in His mercy hast given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Ghost.

The people may greet one another in the name of the Lord by saying, "Peace be with you."

COLLECT OF THE DAY

- Decord, in the wondrous Sacrament of Your Son's Body and Blood You have left us a remembrance of Your passion. Grant that we may soon receive the sacred mystery of Your body and blood that the fruits of Your redemption may continually be manifest in us; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Ghost, one God, now and forever.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Exodus 24:3-11

³ Moses came and told the people all the words of the LORD and all the rules. And all the people answered with one voice and said, "All the words that the LORD has spoken we will do." ⁴ And Moses wrote down all the words of the LORD. He rose early in the morning and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and twelve pillars, according to the twelve tribes of Israel. ⁵ And he sent young men of the people of Israel, who offered burnt offerings and sacrificed peace offerings of oxen to the LORD. ⁶ And Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he threw against the altar. ⁷ Then he took the Book of the Covenant and read it in the hearing of the people. And they said, "All that the LORD has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient." ⁸ And Moses took the blood and threw it on the people and said, "Behold the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words."

It would have been better for that man if he had not been born."


